AMERICA IN CIRCULATION

This exhibit features hundreds of examples of US paper currency, from the Colonial era to the present. State-of-the-art technology provides interactivity for exploration of the artistry, symbolism and security of US money.



ALEXANDER HAMILTON EXPERIENCE

Alexander Hamilton was not just a Founding Father—he was the architect of the American financial system. This gallery brings his legacy to life through a multilingual AI-generated Hamilton, surrounded by rare artifacts and original documents from the Museum's collection.

A FINANCIAL REVOLUTION

The largest of the exhibits brings to life the founding of the US financial system, to mark the nation's 250th anniversary. It features hundreds of documents and objects from the Museum's world-class 18th century collection, many of which have never been on public display.



INVESTING IN US FINANCIAL HISTORY

This six-station interactive timeline enables visitors to take a deeper dive into the history of the US financial markets, from the 18th century through today.



THE FUTURE OF FINANCE

This exhibit takes visitors on a journey from ancient ledgers to bitcoin mining and staking—with digital storytelling, physical artifacts and interactive experiences. Topics include blockchain, crypto, tokenization and the evolution of financial technology.
